

# Holy Family Council 10019 Gifts Hope House Money to purchase New Ultrasound Machine

June of this year our council was approached by a representative from Care Net of Mid-Coast Maine. They are a 100% donor supported, non-denominational, non-political pregnancy help center created to help women make informed decisions about unexpected pregnancies.

Knowing that our Knights of Columbus, Holy Family Council 10019, thru our Pro-Life program, had donated an Ultrasound machine eleven years ago, to Hope House in Lewiston and knowing that this machine was nearing its life expectancy, would we accept the challenge to buy another new machine with their help? Their help was to gift us seed money equal to half the cost of a new machine. Our job was to match that amount with the remainder.

Fortunately, Supreme Council has such a program well established, we merely needed to fill in the appropriate paperwork and file a request. The paperwork was a time-consuming application which took months to complete by all involved, Hope House, doctor and nurse training, State Deputy and finally Supreme Council. With all steps climbed, we reached our goal. In late November we heard that the application was accepted, a check was in the mail.

On December 20, 2023, State Deputy Jon Harvey and Holy Family Council Grand Knight Bruce Labrecque presents checks to Hope House co-founders Bruce and Jan Willson, totaling \$31,885.33 for the purchase of a new Ultrasound machine. This new machine will replace their old one, which was in weekly use at Hope House for eleven years.

# Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest

December 15, 2023



In the fall of 2023, twenty eight eighth grade students at Saint Dominic Academy in Auburn, Maine, wrote an essay for the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. The theme this year was "How can the Church Evangelize in the Digital Age?" These students helped us learn many different ways to evangelize in this digital time!

Essays were scored on 3 factors: content 35pts, grammar 30pts and style 35pts, making a possible score of 100pts. Seven judges made up of 2 Dominican Sisters, 2 retired professional women and 3 Sir Knights judged each essay. Approximately 25 to 30 hours were spent scoring all the essays.

Normally we award the top three place winners with a certificate and monetary prizes of \$75, \$50 and \$25 respectively. This year, however, there was a slight twist.

First, understand that for each essay there is a total of 21 scores: 3 scores for Content, Grammar and Style times 7 judges. Then all are averaged to give a final score. Well, after all scores were tabulated, and going out 3 decimal places, we had three students that each had the same average of 94.286. It was brought up to our Council and the decision was made to award all three 1st place winners and each \$75. The probability of three exact scores out to three decimal places is insane.

# SPRED: Special Religious Education and Sacramental Preparation

Dedicated to meeting the spiritual needs of our brothers and sisters with disabilities, and welcoming them into the life of the Church.

SPRED is a symbol-using catechetical program for persons with physical, mental or emotional challenges. The SPRED program also serves as a resource for helping parishes create and nurture caring Church communities where people of all abilities can participate. The program began in the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1960 and is now offered by 14 Dioceses in the United States and 17 others around the world. All of the Maine SPRED programs are under the direction of the Parish Inclusion Ministry of Catholic Charities of Maine. St. Joseph's SPRED of Prince of Peace Parish was established in 1991, and is one of seven SPRED groups in the Portland Diocese.

St. Joseph's SPRED of the Prince of Peace Parish seeks to serve the spiritual needs of special-needs youth of the area by:

- Providing programs that help prepare them for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Conformation and First Holy Communion.
- Nurturing an on-going formation of Faith
- Facilitate meaningful and supportive participation by these individuals and their families in the life of the church.

SPRED meets at 6:00 pm every other Wednesday evening at Sacred Heart Church Hall at 8 Sacred Heart Place in Auburn. New friends from areas nearby are always welcome.
