Saint Dominic Academy's Eight Grader John Lydon wins State Finals in the 2023-2024

Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest.

This contest encourages today's youth to be more connected to their community and their faith. The goal of this program is to involve young Catholics in grades 8 to 12 (public, private, parochial or home schools during the current school year) in civic discourse and instill in them religious and life-affirming values. Holy Family Council 10019 sponsors all 8th graders at Saint Dominic's Academy in Auburn, Maine. Essays should be 500-750 words on a specific topic, changing every other year. Entrants will be judged on grammar, style, and how clearly they present the theme in a way that showcases creativity, imagination and overall development of the topic.

On December 15, 2023, Holy Family Council awarded three 8th graders first place and submitted them to the Maine State Council for further judging. After all applications from councils across the State, John Lydon, from Saint Dom's, was declared State of Maine Champion for 8th graders.

John gave his ideas on "How can the Church evangelize in the digital age?" Following is John's essay:

"In today's digital era, the Church has incredible opportunities to spread its message and connect with people in new and innovative ways. In this essay, I will be discussing how the Catholic Church can use modern day social media and technological devices to spread the word of God to the people on earth.

Mother Angelica, a catholic Nun, was the known founder of an international cable network called EWTN. Over 20 years ago, starting in 1981, she developed a way for Catholics to join together in Catholism using radio and television. She wanted a better way to communicate matters of the Catholic Church. This is a great example of how someone took technology that was available and used it to benefit Catholics worldwide.

We now live in a modern age where there are new ways to gather as a community. Platforms such as YouTube, TikTok, and Twitter (X) provide opportunities for the Church to share uplifting messages, inspirational quotes, and thought-provoking content. By utilizing these platforms, the Church can reach people where they are, in the comfort of their own homes or on their smartphones. Additionally, live streaming and online services have become increasingly popular, especially in recent times when physical gatherings may not be possible. By embracing technology, the Church can provide virtual worship experiences, allowing individuals to participate in services from anywhere in the world. Steps to pray:

 INVOKE Invite the Holy Spirit to guide the reading of the Scripture.



4. PRAY Begin to dialogue with the Lord and open yourself to his will.



2. READ Ask yourself: What is this passage saying? If you can, use a Bible commentary.



5. CONTEMPLATE

Listen closely with your heart and put into practice what he has told you.
