

I would like to begin this report by saying a special prayer for Baby Mav and his family.

"Lord of all, we thank you for your work in creation, for nourishing life in the womb, for your love even in death. Thank you for the life of Baby Maverick, whom you gave to us and have taken to yourself. Thank you for the arms of your love, embracing both us and Maverick into your family. Amen"

Whether you realize it or not, this whole event was without a doubt a **God Moment**.

Let me explain. During our December council meeting, I stood at the podium and told the story of Baby Mav. I was only asking for special prayers for this great little warrior who was fighting for his life every moment of his very young life. Mav was alive then and we all had hope for him. I explained his condition and what the family was going through. I was only asking for prayers.

Before I finished talking, one of our brother knights mentioned our planned "I Survived Nine" supper and could we donate some of the profits to help the family of Baby Mav with some of their massive accumulated expenses. After all, this was the reason we started this program. So, we agreed to purchase the material for the I Survived Nine program and donate the rest to the Baby Mav family. I call this <u>God</u> <u>Moment #1</u>.

The next several days, three brother knights went to several businesses in several towns and obtained permission to put up posters of the Benefit Bean Supper. As everyone saw at the supper, many businesses donated gift certificates to be auctioned off in our silent auction. I call this <u>God moment #2</u>.

Every bit of the food for the bean supper was donated by businesses such as the beans by an anonymous donor, 15 pounds of bologna and another 15 pounds of ham from Future Foods of Mechanic Falls, 7 gallons of cold slaw from Ward's Neighborhood Market, 8 loaves of bread from Luigis, 24 dozen rolls from Grants Bakery, cups, plates, napkins from Hannaford, a beautiful flower arrangement from Blais Flower Shop, many desserts and a pot of chili from individual moms (and some dads). If I forgot anyone, please forgive me. There were many hours of volunteer work from the knights and their wives. My heart has been touched by the generosity of so many people. These, I call <u>God moments #3</u>.

After experiencing the recent tragedy in Lewiston, it was heart-warming to see something good happening in our community and very much needed.

<u>God moment #4</u> was extra special. The "I Survived 9" program originally needed \$1100 to purchase new material to help promote the program. The eve before the supper, our treasurer found that the "I Survived 9" account still had \$2300 remaining in it from the previous fund raiser which, until that day, was not realized by anyone. That meant that the program really already had money and the director of the program then suggested that all moneys from this supper should go to the Baby Mav Family. <u>A very special God moment!</u>

So, without further ado, I would like tell you all how much the supper generated for funds. Oh! Wait! That is supposed to be a surprise for the family! So I cannot make it public yet. However, on February 13th at our 7pm council meeting, the Wilkins family will be present to receive the news. Come to the meeting and find out!!!




"I Survived 9" MISSION STATEMENT


OBITUMRIES

He was born on February 5, 1951 in Biddeford, the son of Reny Remillard Sr and Georgia A. Remillard. Reny grew up in Old Orchard Beach. He helped his father Reny L. Remillard Sr. with the family business by assisting in recycling old wire and other small projects. Many years ago, he enjoyed working at Creative Works Systems with his older brother Larry and his nephew Michael. He enjoyed making and collecting models and cars and enjoyed listening to Elvis Presley. He was also a huge New England Patriots and Boston Redsox fan. Mr. Remillard had many friends

at the home he was living at in Lewiston. He enjoyed going on local day trips into the community. Mr. Remillard was a Knight of Columbus at Holy Family Council 10019 and a member of the VFW and American Legion in Old Orchard Beach. Steps to pray:



3. MEDITATE

1. INVOKE

Invite the Holy Spirit to guide the reading of the Scripture.



4. PRAY

Begin to dialogue with the Lord and open yourself to his will.



2. READ

Ask yourself: What is this passage saying? If you can, use a Bible commentary.



5. CONTEMPLATE

Listen closely with your heart and put into practice what he has told you.
