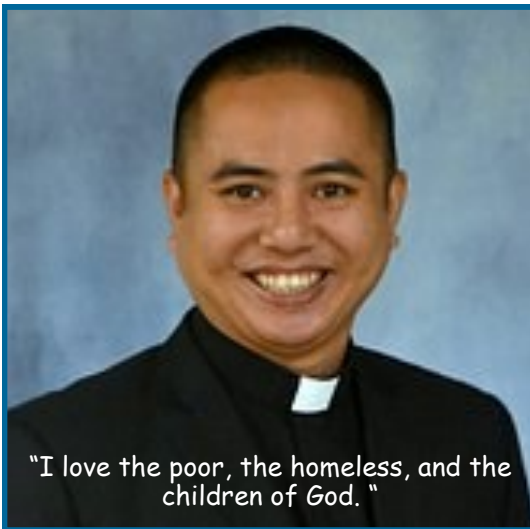

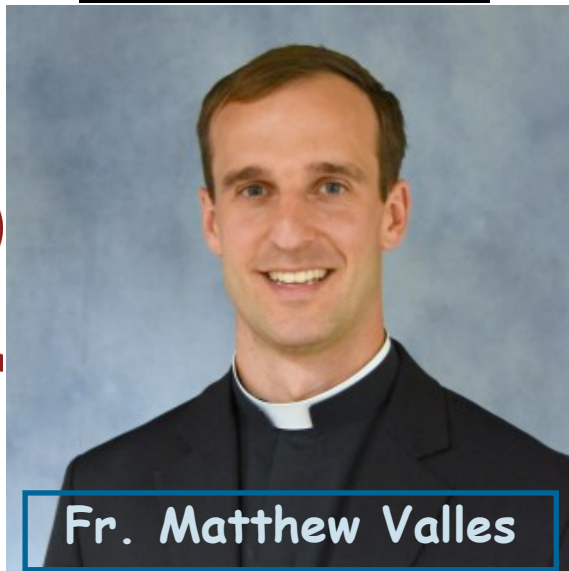

He was a Honorary Life member of the Knights of Columbus at Holy Family Council 10019 of Lewiston. He joined the Knights on June 7, 1995.

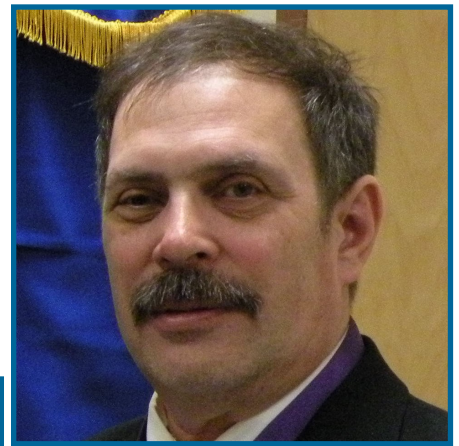
He was also a Sir Knight and Honorary Life member in the Rev. Peter C. Conroy Assembly 2516 since June 1, 1996.
